## Steward

At a recent Fresh Start workshop, we were reminded that the key part of the word “stewardship” is our role as a “steward”. Of course, that sent me hunting through some of my dictionaries for the meanings of these words. Penguin defines “steward” as a person who manages the provisioning ... and attends to the needs of ... . Webster’s has it as one who manages another’s financial affairs or property. Highroads says it is one who takes care of another’s property. My older Collins defines it as a man who manages the affairs of another (it follows with a stewardess is a female who ...).

My older Collins and Highroads define “stewardship” as the office of a steward. Both Penguin and Webster’s only show “stewardship” as a noun tagged to the end of the entry for “steward”.

The first definition in Highroads for “office” is that which one does or ought to do. My old Collins only says it’s a place of business or a function.

**OUR RECTOR WRITES FROM HIS DESK ...****Summer**

Summer means different things to different people. For me, it is a time to rest and renew. I go about this in various ways such as sitting around a campfire listening to Krista and Connor playing guitar and singing while Brynne sings and makes the most incredible smores. I also like to take long walks around St. Malo. A little known local attraction is the incredible Grotto near the town of St. Malo. Nestled behind a tiny Roman Catholic Church is an amphitheatre bordered by the Rat River. As you stand on a boardwalk you look down at a 20ft Crucifix that stands in front of pews for 400. All of this is outdoors. It is a very peaceful place to pray, read or just to pause and take in creation.

Summer is also a time when the BBQ returns to full duty after having rested through most of the winter. However, this year my BBQ may not get the attention it deserves as my family gifted me with a smoker for my last birthday....mmmmmm....smoked brisket, chicken, salmon and ribs. There's nothing quite like it. The gift proves that years and years of begging sometimes pays off.

One of the early gastronomic delights of the season is fresh strawberries. Some people like to eat them 'as is' while others prefer them with cream. I even know some people who dip them in sour cream and then brown sugar!! I thought I would share a particular way I like to prepare them.

First of all, ensure the strawberries are local and ripe so that they are at their sweetest. Next, using one of those fat straws you get at a local fast food outlet (no skinny straws please), gently poke the straw through the strawberry from the bottom right through the top. Then remove the straw. You will have cored the strawberry. Do this to all your strawberries placing them on wax paper when you are done. Then, using a double boiler, melt some good quality chocolate and allow to cool slightly before pouring the chocolate into the strawberries thereby creating a chocolate core. Place the strawberries in the refrigerator. Now travel to your local pharmacy and ask the pharmacist for syringe and needle. She will ask why and you tell her. You'll get the syringe and needle and a thank you for the recipe. On your way home stop by the local LC and pick up a small bottle of Kirsch. Shortly before you serve the strawberries inject them with the Kirsch. If you do this too far in advance they get mushy. Serve to family and friends. Yummy.....

All recommendations are expected to be received by the June Parish Council meeting. Implementation of approved plans is expected to begin in September. The input of many parishioners has been greatly appreciated as we move through our planning process.

From the April 27th Parish Council meeting:

- The first two chapters of Changing the Conversation were discussed.
- The March 2016 Finance Report was discussed. Details are in this “by George!”.
- The plan to sponsor a Syrian refugee family was discussed.
- Committee development of the Parish Plan continues e.g. Worship and Communications. Input from all Committees is expected by the June Parish Council meeting.
- Hospitality is planning a Chili Cook-Off on June 3. Tickets for a wine raffle will be ready by early May and the draw will be during a dinner on September 18.
- A bulletin board for Parish Council items will be installed in the Parish Hall.
- A petition to the bishops about same sex blessings will be available in the Parish Hall for any who wish to sign it.

- Courtesies were given to Geri Morgan for the Garage Sae, Marlene Ramsey and M&M Committee for the updated refugee board, Gwyneth Jones for working with Simon on pastoral visits, Darren Klein for his demeanor, and Rick Morgan, Daryl Ferguson, and Bill Owen for the Refugee Concert.
- The next Parish Council meeting is May 18.

Here are the highlights:

The 2016 Net Loss to the end of March is \$3 092. This is unfavourable to Budget and to last year.

Variances of \$700 or more to Budget are:

- Interest Earned is \$2 081 unfavourable. The TD statement wasn't received in time.
- Identified Giving is \$5 641 unfavourable to Budget and \$5 706 unfavourable to last year. This is changes in the congregation.
- Open Plate is \$3 547 unfavourable. This is timing of United Way donations.
- 
- Sundry Rental is \$763 favourable. This is a wedding.
- Rector's Stipend and Living Allowance are offsets
- Strategy Implementation is \$3 547 unfavourable. This is an accrual and a bill not received until April.
- General Maintenance is \$3 582 favourable. This is timing.
- Utilities – Natural Gas is \$1 518 favourable. This is timing.

While the **Net Income (Loss)** shows how we are doing this year, the **Summary Balance Sheet** shows what we have accumulated over the life of the church:

Note: as the auditors' review of 2015 hadn't been received, this Summary Balance Sheet does not reflect it.

The chequing account is reconciled to the end of March 2016.

Our Balance Sheet includes about 32 **Designated Funds**. These Funds range in size from less than \$100 to over \$100 000. The key aspect of each Fund is the money can only be spent on what the money was donated or raised for. For example, the Designated Fund – Christmas Cheer can only be used for the Christmas Cheer. Some Funds have ongoing activity and some don't.

Changes to Designated Funds > \$500 in March:

- Refugee Fund: +\$675, donations
- Syrian Refugee Fund: +\$5 300, donations
- M&M General: -\$500, bus project
- Sabbatical Provision: +\$539, quarterly provision

### **Auditors**

The Exchange Chartered Professional Accountant L.L.P. have completed the review of our 2015 statements and documents. The auditors state “Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that these financial statements are not, in all material respects, in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profits.”.

The reviewed net loss on operations for 2015 was \$5 447. This was the net loss of \$5 551 reported at the AGM less a late TD interest item of \$104.

As reported earlier, there also was a realized loss on a sale of an investment during 2015 and unrealized losses on investments held at year end. This sale was needed to prevent further losses; the amount was \$11 310. The unrealized losses were due to the drop in oil prices and the Canadian dollar; the amount of \$39 313 was consistent with the other audit clients.

At about noon on Sunday May 29<sup>th</sup>, anyone interested can meet me in the Guild Room to discuss any aspect of our financial report.
