HIGHLIGHTS OF THE SERMON OF BISHOP DON PHILLIPS**Readings On September 22, 2013**

Jeremiah 8: 18 to 9:1

I Timothy 2: 1-7

Luke 16: 1-13 (The shrewd manager)

Bishop Don stood in the Nave for this sermon. He recalled the first time he became aware that there would be a change in the Incumbent Priest position in St George's. At the beginning, there was no idea how long it might be to obtain an Interim Priest. As the Church Canon Law states that the Bishop is the incumbent in a Parish with a vacancy, it was very appropriate that he would come to preside and preach today. This is rather like being "principal for the day" in a school, or "Mayor for the day" in City Hall. Fortunately, an Interim Priest appointment has been made, and Rev Brent Neumann is now in Ontario attending a course on Interim appointment duties. The Bishop anticipates that the interim period will be considerably shorter than last time, but long enough for the Parish to work through the necessary steps.

For the Parish, it is an important and pivotal time, and the work to be done during transition may be compared to the pitcher in a ball game when the team is winning by a small margin. In those circumstances, a different pitcher takes over to finish the game without losses. On the other hand, the Interim Priest might be regarded as an "opener" rather than a "closer". Advice to Parish Members: if things new and different get beyond you, SAY SOMETHING. There is a sense of the group being a spiritual reality. The Holy Spirit will work through you. Change and loss of the familiar is rather like breaking up with a steady girlfriend/boyfriend; there is both grief and liberation.

Today's Collect was "Teach us to discern your hand in all your works". Today's reading from Jeremiah anticipates the Babylonian conquest and destruction of Israel, and is a painful cry of hopelessness – "Is there no balm in Gilead?" The medicinal balm is valued, and it is the expectation that God does and will provide. Imagine a situation where a parent (you) had a child who was really "messed up" and was facing consequences. What would you do? While hating the harmful actions, you would help because you love them. That's what God does.

In the Luke reading about the story of the "dishonest manager", the steward gives back to the debtors the portion of their debt which was probably actually his commission or percentage as manager for the owner. The owner recognized the shrewdness of this as the manager was reinforcing his relationship with clients in preparation for being out of work and homeless. The message of Jesus? Relationships with others are more important than acquisition of wealth. Mammon is wealth not subject to the will of God. In the language of idolatry, you cannot serve God and Mammon.

As well as offering ourselves as individuals to God's will by opening ourselves to recognize God at work, this is also true of our corporate life as a group, so we may offer ourselves individually and as a group.

The Bishop led the congregation in confession of faith.

To quote the title of Mary Lile Benham’s 1983 history of St. George’s: ONCE MORE UNTO THE BREACH!!

Here are the highlights:

The 2013 Net Loss to the end of August is \$15 189. This is favourable to Budget but unfavourable to last year. Variances of \$700 or more to Budget are:

- Fundraising is \$11 593 favourable. This is due to Special Events and the Garage Sale.
- Interest Earned is \$1 327 favourable. This is timing.
- Special & Designated is \$943 favourable. This is due to weddings and funerals.
- Identified Giving is \$3 118 favourable to Budget and \$2 683 favourable to last year.
- Sundry Rentals is \$870 favourable. This is due to more unplanned events.
- Altar Guild is \$743 favourable. This is timing.
- Assistant's Salary is \$730 favourable. This is timing.
- Music Honorarium is \$890 favourable. None of the honoraria are budgeted.
- Relief Organist and Musicians is \$775 favourable. This is timing.
- General Maintenance is \$1 650 unfavourable. This is largely unplanned plumbing repairs.
- Utilities - Electricity is \$1 487 favourable to Budget due to timing

While the **Net Income (Loss)** shows how we are doing this year, the **Summary Balance Sheet** shows what we have accumulated over the life of the church:

Designated Funds

Our Balance Sheet includes about 35 Designated Funds. These Funds range in size from less than \$100 to over \$100 000. The key aspect of each Fund is the money can only be spent on what the money was donated or raised for. For example, the Designated Fund – Christmas Cheer can only be used for the Christmas Cheer. Some Funds have ongoing activity and some don't.

2012 Auditors' Report

In the May “by George!”, it was reported the auditor's draft for the review engagement showed a \$244 decrease in Net Income for late General Maintenance and Investment items from the \$1 402 reported at the AGM and a \$6 382 Unrealized Gain on Investments held at year-end.

We received the auditors' final review reports. The final results are the same as the draft results previously reported, a Net Income of \$1 158 and a \$6 382 Unrealized Gain on Investments held at year-end. Many of the financial statements indicate unaudited, as their review did not constitute an audit. Based on the review, our financial statements are in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. A complete copy of the review is available in the church office.

STEWARDSHIP MATTERS

Over the past years, Parish Council has been presenting budgets to the Parish which have covered the cost of running the Parish. In an attempt to keep the budget balanced, very little discretionary spending was included. Opportunistic events such as low fuel prices combined with a warmer winter, resulted in income being sufficient to cover operating costs last year. This year, the parish accepted a budget that forecasted a \$20,000 deficit. Although the final number will not be known until the end of the year, we are still projecting a deficit at the end of the year.

At the September 18th meeting of Parish Council, it was decided this year's Stewardship Campaign would identify the level of giving required to balance the 2014 budget and the projected level of giving required to put programs in place that would aid with parish development. Pledge cards will be individualized and include three figures: the present level of giving, the level of giving required to balance the 2014 budget, and the projected level of giving required to put programs in place that would aid with Parish Development.

It is recognized that there may be a lot of questions regarding this strategy. The Stewardship Chair will be making a presentation with a representative from Corporation on this new strategy during the announcements on September 29th. We will also be in the Parish Hall during coffee to answer any questions on this strategy.

Over the past number of years, the Stewardship Committee has asked a variety of parishioners to express their thoughts on all topics relating to Stewardship. There have been two things in common with most speakers, a great feeling of apprehension prior to the talk about sharing their thoughts on Stewardship and a great feeling of reward following the experience.

This year the Stewardship Committee is looking for two people to speak to this very important topic. There times are available October 6th and October 13th. The talk should be about 4 to 6 minutes long and can be on Time and Talent and/or Financial Stewardship. It would also be a good opportunity to express strategies that will help the parish with our Stewardship challenges.

Just a reminder that October 20th is Stewardship Sunday. Tom Denton will be our speaker that day.
